### 100 YEARS AGO

**Local:** On 7<sup>th</sup> March the brakes of the 11am Heavitree -Dunsford Hill tram failed on Fore Street's 1 in 11 gradient; it collided with a horse & cart, killing the horse. It overturned on hitting the bridge One passenger, Mrs Mary Findlay was killed.

**National:** British hospital ship damaged by a mine in the Channel. British hospital ship torpedoed off Start Point. British forces took Baghdad and began advance into Palestine.

**International:** Tsar Nicholas II abdicated when soldiers refused to act against protesters in Petrograd- the first Russian Revolution of 1917.


### BRAIN SPRING CLEAN - QUIZ

With a slight change in direction in her vocation she was ordained in the Anglican Church in 2001. Now a Bishop, she brings with her experience of caring and of how politics and bureaucracy work. In many ways she didn't feel there had been that much of a change - she's still the same person with the same vocation to care for others. She said of herself, 'I'm a good civil servant. I can listen. I can respond appropriately.' She did respond very well to a variety of interesting questions. Our thanks go to the Cridford staff for their welcome and hard work. And at the end of the evening we expressed our thanks to Bishop Sarah for giving up her time to join us in Trusham.
