## THIS MONTH.....

### 100 YEARS AGO

**Local:** On 24<sup>th</sup> September ten NZ soldiers were killed and two injured. Alighting from a troop train at Bere Ferrers, they were struck by the Waterloo to Plymouth express. They had just disembarked at Plymouth from New Zealand.

**National:** Discontent at continued harsh treatment in grim conditions at the Etaples (British) base camp, escalated into mutiny after a corporal was killed. Hundreds chased the military police. Over a thousand soldiers broke out of the camp. After several days, cavalry, with machine gun support restored control.

**International:** A change of tactics saw success for British and Empire troops in the Battle of Menin Road, soon followed by the Battle of Polygon Wood.
