THIS MONTH

100 YEARS AGO

Local: Referring to improvement of Trusham's water supply, Dr Mapleton, Medical Officer of Health, told Newton Abbot Rural District Council, that nothing fresh could be provided without unreasonably cost. He suggested a well at the bottom of the village might be put in order.

National: July 22nd Irish War of Independence halted, after the Anglo-Irish truce was officially declared in London.

International: July 18th the first vaccination against tuberculosis was given ((Bacille Calmette-Guérin). With high safety records, the BCG is the most widely used vaccine, with over 4 billion recipients. This 100 year old vaccine is now being tested to see if it might boost the immune system to reduce respiratory symptoms related to coronavirus infections.

TRUSHAM CHURCH

The Church should be open soon. The churchyard is open, with lovely views, from the memorial garden, interesting gravestones and fauna - rabbits, birds - and flora - described by Audrey in her village email. From early lockdown, flowers and grasses were left to grow - an amazing variety from Easter violets to summer roses - the white rose by the porch has been stunning. There has been recent grass-cutting, with areas left untouched, giving some species mentioned by Audrey further opportunity to flourish. *Judith Rowland*

Payment: by card, by phone; under £30 contactless through the pub window.

Pick up a coffee, cake and snacks from the bench outside on our terrace. We will keep in touch with what is on offer and when it is available.

EARLIER...

TRUSHAM SCHOOL



One hundred years ago, on July 30th 1920, it was noted in the school log that the school was closed and the children were dismissed for a five week summer break.

While there are no photographs of the pupils on our village website, in the section accessed by clicking on Family History (4th item on the left-hand navigation bar), the final item on the Family History navigation bar is School Logs. At the bottom of the first page is 'Admissions Register'. This section contains details of every child who was recorded on the Trusham School roll from the school's opening in January 1879 to the end of August 1938. Details include name, date of birth, parent/guardian, address, previous school, standard reached and date of leaving.

The children were admitted at a tender age, often having to walk quite some distance - along untarred lanes, whatever the weather.

There are familiar addresses to which names can be added.

PAST PICTURES

Trusham hasn't changed a great deal - there are both buildings and names that were here a hundred and more years ago.

Dating photographs can be tricky. The Alms Houses have been here for over 300 years.

The view up Church Lane isn't quite the same as now - Hillside seems to have lost something..

The clothing, especially the boys' collars and girls' straw hats suggest late Victorian - early Edwardian styles, though maybe styles spread slowly to small villages. The 1901 Census doesn't include this number of children living in the Alms Houses. Was it a celebration - Edward's coronation or were they merely relatives crowding in to have their picture taken
