100 YEARS AGO

Local: Richard Sandford, submarine commander from Exeter won the VC for his actions during the dangerous raid on Zebrugge. (*Blue plaque 15 Cathedral Close*)

National: The Royal Flying Corps and Royal Naval Air Service merged to form The RAF. The Women's Royal Air Force was set up, providing ground staff.

International: Germany launched a second Spring Offensive, the *Battle of the Lys*, in the British sector of Armentieres. Manfred Albrecht Freiherr von Richthofen (Red Baron), responsible for the deaths of many British/Allied airmen was shot down.
