100 YEARS AGO

Local: Four new pupils, Hugh, Fernley, Frank and George Bray from Chudleigh joined Trusham school, giving a total of 35 on roll.

National: The December 14th General Election (with most women aged over 30 and all men over 21 being allowed to vote) resulted in a 238 seat majority for a coalition led by David Lloyd George

International: Woodrow Wilson made the first ever visit to Britain by a serving US President. His brief tour, on his way to the Paris Peace Conference, including a visit to Carlisle - his mother's birth-place and Manchester, where he addressed a large crowd

CHRISTMAS CONCERT

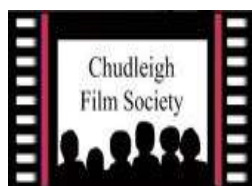


Dunsford Singers, a Teign Valley Choir, invite you to Dunsford VH on **Sunday 2nd December 4pm** or Teign Valley Community Hall

TRUSHAM'S TRIBUTE

Over seventy people gathered at our modest war memorial to remember those who had died in conflict on the 100th anniversary of the Great War armistice. As names on the memorial were read out, children came forward with named poppy sprays.

The British Legion wreath was laid by Tom Dyer whose great great uncle Sidney Dyer, also a Trusham boy, was one of the Devonshire Regiment's many casualties killed on the Somme in 1916.

As well as these marks of respect to the war dead, ceramic poppies made by villagers, aided by Diana Tingley, were planted on the grassy slope below the memorial and, as a symbol of hope, red bunting was draped on the war memorial's surrounds. Villagers had inscribed on the pennants 'peace' in sixty different languages, a fitting illustration of the final hymn 'For the healing of the nations'.
