100 YEARS AGO

Local: There was outrage in Plymouth over the eviction of Coxside tenants, whose homes were claimed for war use - housing dockyard workers.

National: GPO raised ordinary letter rate to 1½d, ending the Uniform Penny Post which had existed since 1840; postcard rate doubled from ½d to 1d.

International: 3rd Battle of the Aisne - German forces 35 miles from Paris; many civilians fled; the government made plans to evacuate to Bordeaux. High casualties: Allies 137,000, Germany 130,000.

Paul Wimsett, our vicar, led us past the War Memorial, stopping to remember all those who suffered during the First World War. Walking down through the fields, we saw varieties of sheep and lambs. At Tinkley, Paul and Steve gave us a fascinating tour. We looked down to the bottom of the now emptied quarry (worked from 150 years ago until the 1930s.). We saw varieties of beautiful pheasants (Himalayan Monal, Lady Amhurst, Reeves, Golden), three types of peacocks, Egyptian ibis and elegant African grey crowned cranes.

After a delicious BBQ we returned to Trusham through the field of pigmy goats and rheas - George, who helps at Tinkley, had to keep the big male rhea at bay, as he fluffed his

feathers, resembling a ballerina in a tutu! The rheas sped around the field, with such a strange gait.

Thank you, Paul, Steve and George, and the BBQ caterers - we had a brilliant afternoon. The weather was kind too!
