100 YEARS AGO

Local: It was claimed that motorists drove as fast as possible through Chudleigh's straight, wide street, causing considerable dust. An application for 10 mph speed limit was supported by the council.

National: March 25th Walter Tull, a British, professional footballer and, against military rules, the first black officer to lead white British soldiers in battle, was killed. He was never awarded the Military Cross, despite recommendation

International: 3rd March Russia signed (the Treaty of Brest-Litovsk with Germany, ceding territory to Germany in return for an end to fighting. Germany could now increase the strength of their attacks on the Western Front.

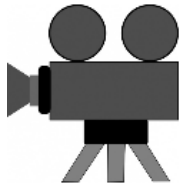
EXETER POLICE & COMMUNITY CHOIR
