### 100 YEARS AGO

**Local:** Freehold farm, Symons, with roomy farmhouse and commodious buildings, situated in Trusham, together with about 116 acres of productive watered meadow, pasture, orchard, and arable land, in the occupation of Messrs Callards as Yearly Lady Day tenants, annual rent £160 8s 6d. The Lordship of the Manor of Trusham is included. Underlying the farm are large deposits of dibasic rock.

**National:** 3 February - Sinn Féin leader Éamon de Valera and two others escaped from Lincoln Prison

**International:** 3 Feb, The first meeting of the League of Nations was held, its purpose to promote international security as well as world peace.

**9<sup>th</sup> February 10am-1pm**



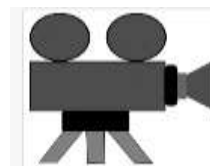

## CHUDLEIGH BAT TRAIL WALK

Enjoy a walk on **Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 9.30am-12.30pm** with the Bat Project along the 'bat trail' around Chudleigh. You will see beautiful countryside and amazing bat habitats (in an area that is important for greater horseshoe bats). Find out



what the bat project team is doing around Chudleigh and how you can help the bats by taking simple steps in your own garden. Wear suitable walking footwear

and clothing. Bring a flask and snack if you like, as we plan to have a short halfway break. The walk is 4.8 miles, taking 3 hours with short stops. As well as road, the route uses footpaths across fields and through woods. Moderate grade difficulty. Muddy with some slippery paths, some steep sections. Not wheelchair or pushchair friendly.
