OFFLEY HENRY CARY 1836-1919

Born at Claines, Worcestershire, to Captain William Lucius Cary and Emily Offley Wakeman Educated at Rugby and Christ Church, Oxford. Headmaster of Sir Thomas Boteler School, Warrington 1863-1881

Rector of Trusham 1882-1919

Married Margaret Harriet Moultrie, daughter of Rev John Moultrie,in 1863 in Rugby.

Three children: Margaret Emily 1864-1920, Henry Lucius Moultrie 1867-1950 and Katherine Amy 1870.

His wife and their daughters are often mentioned in the school log with their visits to assist with needlework and other lessons. Margaret died in 1894, her funeral service in Trusham was conducted by their son who was ordained and living in Oxford. Katherine is recorded in Red Cross records as a volunteer nurse, living in Trusham Rectory.

Offley Cary was Trusham's rector for almost forty years, Although from a different



background to most of his flock, he seemed at peace with his mission in this small Devon village.
