THIS MONTH

100 YEARS AGO

Local: The landmark, Haldon Belvedere was among lots at an auction held at the Rougemont Hotel, Exeter, in connection with the disposal of part of the Haldon Estate. Having attracted few bids, it was withdrawn at a bid of £600.

National: The second reading of the Irish Home Rule bill passed, to allow two separate parliaments, effectively partitioning Ireland. PM Lloyd George said self-determination would not be granted.

International: Wolfgang Kapp led a Freikorps (rightwing ex-soldiers) takeover in Berlin. The regular army refused to attack the Freikorps. The government fled. Kapp was defeated as workers went on strike, refusing to cooperate with him.

Ron Howell, Secretary of the South West Maritime Archaeological Group, will give an illustrated talk "*1000 Years of History from the Sea - The Salcombe Wrecks.*" The SWMAG covers 4 wrecks discovered in one area of the seabed including a Bronze Age wreck and one carrying Islamic gold.

Exhibits from these wrecks are on

display in the British Museum, Exeter Museum and in the Plymouth Art Gallery.


CANCER LIFELINE SOUTH WEST QUIZ

Operation London Bridge: the landowner has given approval.

Devon Community Together: future meeting re emergency plan; village to be invited to attend

Climate Emergency; agreed to take up Liz Bartlett's suggestion of a community Freegle event.

Speeding/Road Signs: "20's plenty for Trusham" website is live. Awaiting a DCC reply re speed reduction. Mark Easton PCSO has advised on relaunch of Community Speed Watch. Phil Brooks will
